DISCUSSING WARD ISSUES WITH JOHN CAMPION, PCC

Town Cllr Juliet Smith, recently 'met' (virtually) with Police and Crime Commissioner, John Campion and ward colleague Cllr Tracey Onslow. A range of policing issues were discussed, including the 300 more police officers we now have in West Mercia (compared to 2016; with 91 more being recruited this year) and the PCC's invaluable support for SmartWater — a unique property marking kit.

More specifically, the value of SmartWater for Greatfield Road was discussed and your Conservative BHS team will look to roll this out as soon as Covid-19 allows.

LOCAL SCOUTS GET NEW PATH TO HUT

Conservative team member Julian Phillips, Cllr Tracey Onslow and the rest of the Blakebrook & Habberley South team are delighted that a new path has been built connecting the car park on Habberley Road with the 8th Wyre Forest Scout Hut, on the far side of Habberley Playing Fields.

Children and parents will no longer be forced to walk through mud when accessing the Scout Hut during the winter.

The path is primarily funded by money that has been raised by the Scout Group, supported by a £1,000 grant from Cllr Onslow's Community Leadership Fund.

With Cllr Onslow's assistance, local party volunteer and member of the Scout Group's Executive Committee, Julian Phillips, has negotiated with Wyre Forest District Council to acquire permission for the path to cross council land.
