New pedestrian crossing refuge for Sutton Park Road



Councillor Nathan Desmond is delighted to announce that work to install a safer pedestrian refuge on the junction of Sutton Park Road and Stourport Road, will start on Monday 21st March.

Currently it's very dangerous for pedestrians to cross the busy junction and Cllr Desmond has been campaigning to Highways to make it safer for pedestrians to cross. The work will see a new, longer and wider central refuge crossing built that will force pedestrians to cross further up Sutton Park Road and away from the busy junction. Together with new drop kerbs and guard rails on the junction, will make crossing the road a safer experience.

Work to start on Monday 21st March for a week and unfortunately there will be disruption to motorists as the junction will be closed to traffic and rerouted around Sutton Road.

Speed awareness

Nicky and Nathan are continuing to look into the issue of speeding traffic on Silverwoods Way, especially between Worcester Road and the roundabout, following residents concerns. Despite speed data survey's showing that average speeds are low, there is still concern that a small minority of drivers continue to break the 30 MPH speed limit.

Both Nicky and Nathan have spoken to the local police team to highlight this issue and request the police carry out speed enforcement. The neighbourhood policing team have reassured Nicky and Nathan that they will prioritise Silverwoods Way, with organised speeding operations, including the deployment of the Pro-laser speed gun.

Nathan has also had one of his speed activated signs relocated to Silverwoods Way to flash warn drivers if they go over the speed limit. This sign will be installed at 4 week intervals on two different locations on Silverwoods Way.

This project will see the removal of the dangerous slabbed area and the complete resurfacing of the pavements, which is long over due and is largely being funded out of Cllr Desmond's devolved Highways monies.

Flooding to pedestrian crossing on Stourport Road

Cllr Kevin Gale is still pushing Highways to tackle the ongoing problem of flooding of the pedestrian crossing on Stourport Road, next to Northumberland Avenue. The crossing is heavily used, especially by parents on the school run and the flooding is extremely bad with heavy rain. Your Conservative team are pushing for Highways to install new drains.

Double yellow lines installed on **Beauchamp Avenue**

Cllr Sally Chambers has had double yellow lines installed on the bend at the bottom of Beauchamp Avenue. Vehicles were parking on this bend causing problems for drivers on this junction. Cllr Chambers is working with Cllr Desmond to tackle the issue of vehicles parking on double yellow lines in Beauchamp **Avenue and Blount Terrace and** they have requested WFDC enforcement team to carry out patrols.
