Scrap evening car parking charges and reintroduce free car parking

> End parking charges after 6pm; restore onehour free parking to one car park in each of our three towns; and reduce the cost of annual car parking permits for over 65s.

Increase the number of Civil Enforcement Officers

> Increasing our Civil Enforcement team from six to seven will enable us to better deal with illegal parking on our estates and in our villages.

Safeguard Bewdley Museum

What is at stake in Bewdley at this election?

Protecting Our Green Belt

Our Green Belt is at stake under a Labour/Green/Independent-led Council. On 26th April 2022, they approved the Local Plan. Museum and Queen Elizabeth II Gardens, offering only a swiftly reducing grant and expecting the Town Council to just raise its precept to cover the additional costs.

We will support our assets but the tax payer must not be unduly burdened.

Your Priorities are our Priorities

We will address issues that are important to you by prioritising front-line services such as street cleaning. tackling fly tipping and dog fouling; and addressing illegal parking. By investing far more heavily in officers, we can tackle these issues on the ground.

We will also work tirelessly to ensure that you get your fair share of services. such as litter picking and bin emptying. WFDC has cut the funding it gives to Town and Parish Councils to carry out this work – even though it has a statutory duty to undertake it – and this is something we oppose.
