What Nathan Desmond has been doing for residents in St Peters



New Pedestrian Crossing for Sutton Road

After a 15 year campaign, I was successful in getting a new signalised pedestrian crossing, installed close to the entrance of Brinton Park.



Hoobrook Island Improvements

I was instrumental in getting £3.6m capital funding that saw capacity increase to three lanes on the island, traffic light signalling, reducing traffic congestion and improving traffic capacity.



Road and Pavement Improvements

I have had roads resurfaced in Aggborough Crescent, Griffin Avenue, Larches Road and new pavements laid in Beauchamp Avenue, Blount Terrace, Northumberland Avenue and Hoo Road.



Working with local groups and schools

I have helped fund, via my Community Fund, a number of initiatives at both Foley Park and Birchen Coppice Primary Schools, local scout and cubs groups and many local organisations such as St Peters Church.

My priorities for St Peters

1 Tackling speeding on the Chester Road

I will look to fund a permanent VAS sign on Chester Road South to alert drivers to their speed and work with the Police on speed camera enforcement.



2 Tackling inconsiderate and illegal parking

Continue to push for more double yellow lines and bollards to be installed on road junctions and areas where there is inconsiderate parking, such as Rifle Range Road, Humphries Drive and Silverwoods Way.



3 Continue to push for more roads & pavements to be resurfaced

Campaign for the worst roads and pavements across the division to be completely resurfaced. Roads such as Oldnall Road are in a really poor condition and need to be resurfaced.



4 Fund further VAS signs deployed on speeding roads

I will continue to prioritise roads, which have a speed issue, such as Hoo Road, Silverwoods Way and Sutton Park Road, and have my three VAS signs deployed to warn motorists.



5 Protecting our Greenbelt and countryside

Will continue to campaign against Labour's increase in Wyre Forest's new mandatory house building quota to 584 per year, up from 276, a 112% increase. This will encroach on local Greenbelt which must be defended.



6 Economic regeneration of Kidderminster Town Centre

I will continue to work with Wyre Forest District Council and WCC to help progress the redevelopment and public realm improvements to Kidderminster Town Centre.
